

## **Learning Online with Michael Rosen**

We were delighted this week that children in Years 1–6 enjoyed a live online lesson with celebrated author and poet Michael Rosen. Michael performed some of his favourite food-inspired poems much to the children's excitement! Known for his playful and inspiring approach to language, Michael engaged the pupils in poetry, storytelling and creative writing, drawing on his wide-ranging work with young readers. The lively, interactive session encouraged everyone to play with words, explore their

own voice and enjoy the magic of poetry. We're so proud of how our pupils responded and look forward to using Michael's ideas further in our writing lessons.



#### Power for Good! Anti-Bullying Week – 10-14<sup>th</sup> November 2025

The pupils have been learning about the idea of the 'Power for Good' this week, and how each of them has the ability to use their own positive power to help others, stand up for what is right, and make school and community a kinder place.

- © On Monday, the children came to school wearing odd socks to celebrate that we are all unique and different. It was a fun, visible way to start the week and to emphasise that our differences are what make us special.
- © Pupils came up with pledges about how they can use their power for good. These pledges may include things like saying something kind, asking someone if they're okay, stepping in when someone is being left out, or simply choosing to be a good friend.
- © We have spent time learning about cyber-bullying what it means, how it can happen and the importance of speaking to a trusted adult if anything online worries or upsets them.
- © The children also had the opportunity to take part in our poster competition, to design their own super-hero, spreading their power for good. We have received so many creative entries, and it is going to be very difficult to choose winners they are all so good!

#### **Year 1 Discovering Toys for this Term's Topic**

The children in Badgers and Foxes classes had a themed day last week, to kick off their new topic, 'How are the toys we play with made?' They brought in their favourite toys from home and compared them to toys from the past.

Last week, children in Hedgehogs class enjoyed a themed day to launch their topic, 'What makes a healthy lunchbox?' The children dressed up as castle kitchen staff and during the day they undertook themed activities, including planning a picnic lunch for the castle staff. They worked collaboratively in groups to plan a healthy lunch and include some favourite games and songs.
