Online Safety

Do you know what material your child is accessing when they are on their mobile phone or tablet? There are so many different ways that children can access online content, including the dark web.

The only way to access the dark web is via a TOR browser. This is via an app which can be installed on any mobile phone. TOR browsers are not illegal, they allow for anonymous internet browsing and there are legitimate reasons why people might use one.

If your child has a TOR app installed, it doesn't mean they are using it to access the dark web, but it is worth taking the time to have a conversation to check and talk about the dangers.

Recycling Incentive Scheme – Good Causes

Have you heard of the recycling incentive scheme run by Bracknell Forest Council? If you sign up to the scheme, each time your recycling bin gets emptied, 200 points are added to your account. These points can be used for several things including green rewards, sessions at Bracknell Leisure Centre and tickets to the Look Out.
