

Wisdom Research Network

We are very excited that our school has become a member of the Wisdom Research Network, which aims to bring together primary and secondary schools in England and academic researchers to enable high-quality mental health research that meets the diverse needs of school communities. Schools that join the network will benefit from engaging with and learning from cutting-edge research, alongside opportunities to connect with other schools to help shape future mental health research.

The Wisdom Research Network is part of a wider project called Mental Health in Development (MHID), part of the Oxford Health Biomedical Research Centre (BRC), which is a partnership with the University of Oxford alongside many other Universities across the country. Important - School Site Safety



nests – yummy!
















Year 5&6
