Year 5 have been looking at playscripts this week and reading 'The Tempest'. They rehearsed the different roles and enjoyed performing their acts to the rest of the class.


















Children in Falcons and Hawks class enjoyed their muchanticipated visit to Kew Gardens this week. The weather was good, the experiences were amazing and the children
