Message from the Headteacher



Message from the School Advisory Board (SAB)

The Autumn Term seems to be rushing by, with half term now upon us. So far this term the School Advisory Board (previously known as Governors) have visited the school to observe a normal day and to witness the experience of the children. We visited all the year groups from Nursery through to Year 6. The pupils in the nursery were quickly learning their daily routines and expectations and experiencing their learning through play. Whilst in Reception class phonics and handwriting was being learnt. Throughout the rest of the school maths lessons were underway, and the SAB could see the way teaching and learning progressed through the year groups.

Our visits into school are always a delight, the children never fail to impress us with their excellent behaviour and their attitude to learning. After this, I met with Mr Ferris and Ms Ellis (Director of School Improvement - Curriculum), where we reviewed the previous academic year, looking at successes and areas that may need 'tweaking' to improve our practice and therefore outcomes for the children.

The first SAB meeting was held in early October, where we discussed the School Improvement Plan and asked Mr Ferris questions. There were also reports on Safeguarding and SEND provision, which were prepared by SAB members. The very impressive SATs results from the summer and information submitted for our meeting, showed that the school is going from strength to strength and puts it in the top 5% of schools nationally for progress made. Congratulations and thanks should go to all the staff and pupils who have made this possible.

There is currently a vacancy for a parent SAB member. If any parent is interested, the forms and details will be sent out over the half term break. Should you wish to ask any questions about the possibility of joining us please contact me via the school, or you can speak to our current parent SAB member, again, by contacting the school. No formal qualifications are required for this voluntary role.


Wishing you all a very relaxing half term break and I look forward to seeing what the next half term brings.
