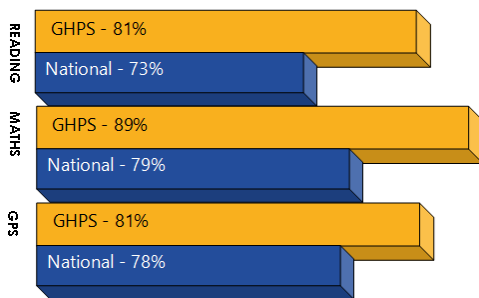

## Re: School Results for 2019

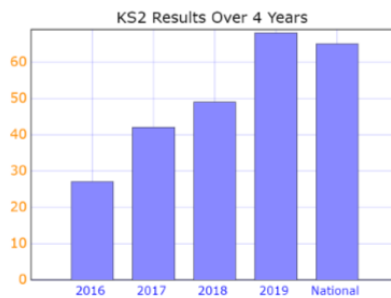

### Year 6 SATs Results

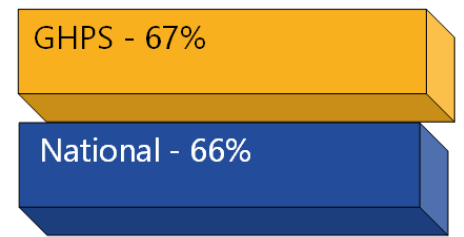


### Key Stage 2 SATs



Percentage of Children who achieved the Expected Standard in R W & M 2019 KS2 Tests

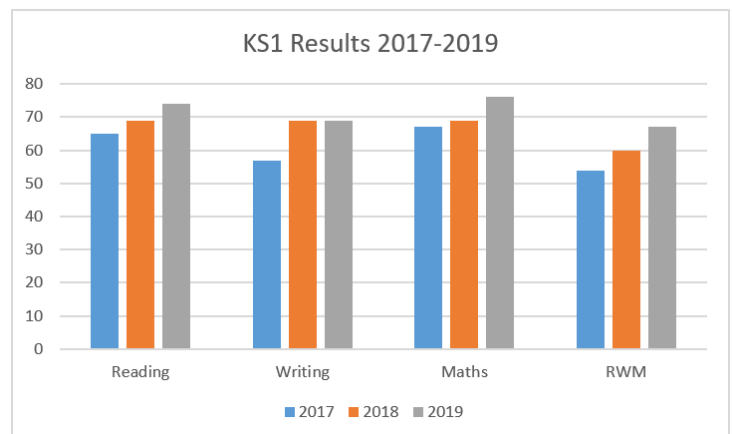
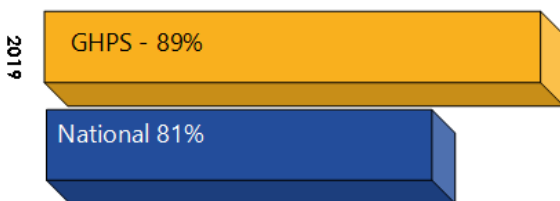
### Results for Key Stage 1

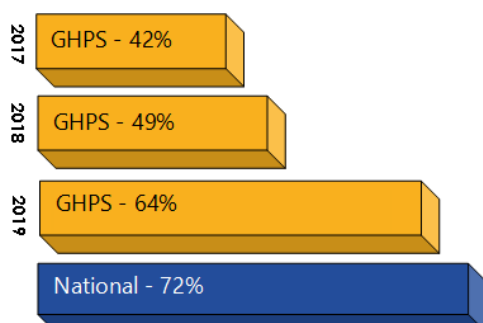
### Our GREAT Results for Phonics Check 2019



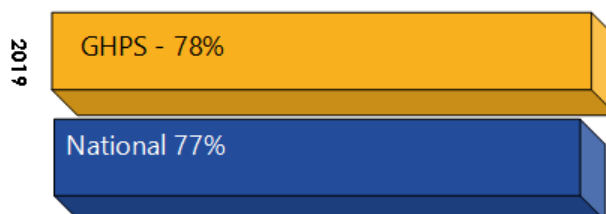
