Curriculum focus of PPG spending in 2014/15

Update February 2015-One to One tuition

Additional teacher support for one hour per week for ten weeks after school hours for 8 children. This support focuses on maths and is delivered to pupils in Years 6 during Autumn 2014/Spring 2015. As of February 2015, all children have made 2 part progress or better with one catching up to their age related expectation.

Booster Classes

Literacy and Numeracy classes delivered to Year 6 pupils for 45 minutes of a morning and after school for a period of ten weeks starting February half term 2015

SENTA's

A continuous provision of highly trained SENTA's supporting core subject development across the whole school-Reading Recovery, Read Write Inc, SALT, Handwriting, Fine Motor skills, Guided Reading

Additional Staffing –Judith Purdy

Additional teacher for maths support for Key Stage 2-One to One Maths support for 5 Year 4 children-pre teaching with two Year 6 groups of 6-8 pupils at different starting points.

February 2015-Year 4-5 under achieving children at 2B...4 have made good progress to 2A/3C with one pupil catching up to the age related expectation.

Year 6-6 under achieving children at 2B/A-5 have caught up to their age related expectation

Year 6-6 under achieving children at 2C-2A-all have made good progress to 3Band but none as yet have caught up to ARE

Additional teacher for writing support for key stage 2 Year 5 pupils Sarah Jane Grindley

Year 5- 7 pupils in a guided reading group-all made very good progress -4 making a whole level progress-6/7 now at the age related expectation

Year 5-9 pupils in a guided writing group-6 children have made 2 part level progress but all remain behind the age related expectation

Year 5 Maths-12 children at 3C-7 pupils have made 2 part level progress with 5/12 catching up to the age related expectation

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

The school will evaluate the impact on each pupil at the end of each term. Evaluation will focus on academic gains and how pupils' self-confidence has developed as a consequence of the intervention.
