You could also enrol your child into the Summer Reading Challenge 2020 which is in a new digital format designed to keep children engaged and interested in reading. This year the Summer Reading Challenge is back and online with Silly Squad! It's all about funny books, happiness and having a laugh! The Summer Reading Challenge website is free to access and features games, quizzes and downloadable activities that incentivise and encourage children to take part in reading related activities. We know that you will be enjoying family time, however here are a few ideas of things that you can do at home to build on Year 2 and prepare for Year 3 should you wish to:

- Consolidate the 2, 5, 10 times tables from Year 2. The children should know these in any order.
- Start to learn 3, 4 and 8 times tables in preparation for Year 3. There are lots of websites to support times tables.
- Continue to use Bug Club and Mathletics to consolidate core reading and maths skills.
- Practice spelling of Year 2 words.
- Develop writing by involving your children in every day writing tasks such as shopping lists. Encourage them to write postcards whilst you are on holiday or keep a diary of their summer.
