

GHPS Update

Dear Parents and Carers,

Next week we will begin to welcome back more children to school in a safe and steady way. If your child is in Nursery, Reception, Year 1 or Year 6 and you have indicated YES in our online survey then you will have already received your information letter outlining details for your child. Pupils in Nursery and Reception Years will start on Monday 8th June; pupils in Year 1 will start on Tuesday 9th June and pupils in Year 6 will start on Wednesday 10th June.

For pupils attending our Critical Key Worker Provision please note that this continues uninterrupted. However, there will be a change in location and new drop off /collection points. Again you will have received a letter outlining our expectations and procedures to follow.

If your child is eligible and you are requesting a new place in our Critical Key Worker provision, please contact the office GHPSoffice@maidenerleghtrust.org to arrange a place.

It is vital that as we begin to welcome children returning to school, everyone knows what to expect and is prepared. There is more information on our website outlining the relevant steps both the school and parents will take in order to keep everyone safe, it can be found here. Everything we are doing is guided by the latest advice from the Government about keeping everyone - children and school staff - as safe as possible.

This is uncharted territory for us all and I recognise how frustrating it can be. I must state how grateful I am you all of our parent community – you have all been amazing through this time. I have heard of many schools being unhelpfully harassed by parents for things that are completely out of their control, this hasn't happened here and I would like to thank you for all you have done to support both your child and the school. Your support and kind words have really helped the team at school, who have remained working throughout this crisis to provide support and learning for our community.

Digital Summer Reading Challenge

The Summer Reading Challenge, presented by the Reading Agency and funded by Arts Council England, encourages children aged 4 to 11 to set themselves a reading challenge to help prevent the summer reading 'dip'.

Each year the Challenge, delivered with the support of public libraries, motivates over 700,000 children to keep reading to build their skills and confidence.

This year, Silly Squad, the Summer Reading Challenge 2020, will celebrate funny books, happiness and laughter. Children taking part in the challenge will join the Silly Squad, an adventurous team of animals who love to have a laugh and get stuck in to all different kinds of funny books!

The 2020 Challenge will feature bespoke artwork from award-winning children's author and illustrator Laura Ellen Ferguson (Amelia Fang; Evil Emperor Penguin; I Don't Want Curly Hair).

With the disruption caused by COVID-19 and the impact of social distancing on schools and public libraries, the 2020 Challenge will launch as a digital activity to keep children reading over the summer and support parents and carers with children already at home. The Challenge will run from June to September, with the official launch day being Friday 5th June 2020.

The digital challenge will be free to access featuring games, quizzes and digital and downloadable activities to incentivise and encourage children and their families to take part in reading related activities at home. Although library buildings are closed, libraries will also continue to deliver the Challenge through virtual services and e-lending platforms.

With school life disrupted and many children missing the company of their friends, this year's fun-filled Summer Reading Challenge will be all the more vital as a way of helping parents and carers find fun, family-friendly activities, maintain literacy levels and create a safe space for children to connect with their peers.

The Challenge is free for children to take part in and is accessible for primary-aged children of all different reading levels.
