Dear Parents and Carers.

This week we welcomed back more children to school. They have settled into their new pods and although things are a little different in school, I have to say we have all adjusted very well.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind parents and carers to keep to their specified drop off and pick up times to enable us to maintain social distancing on and around the school site and please do not arrive early for school.

If your child is eligible and you need to request a new place in our Critical Key Worker provision, please contact the office GHPSoffice@maidenerleghtrust.org to arrange a place.

As you will know the government recently announced that they will not be asking schools to prepare to welcome back pupils in Years 2-5. We are still waiting for detailed guidance from the Department for Education and once this is released we will plan what this looks like for GHPS, both for now and for September.

Please know that we are continuing to work hard for all of our children, by reducing class sizes to pods of 15 we have doubled the number of staff needed to teach the pods. This leaves us with less staff to support pupils learning at home, however we have managed to re-organise and can keep providing home learning resources to all pupils who need them. I would like to thank the hardworking, dedicated staff who have been working throughout the pandemic and who are now stepping up even further to support our children here at GHPS.
