#### Dear Parents and Carers,

Where has the sunshine gone? This week our school has continued to adjust very well to our newer COVID secure systems and despite the heavy downpours we have still manged to enjoy lots of time outdoors in between the showers.

A huge thank you to all adults who come onto the school site for their responsible attitude to following our systems and keeping a respectful distance between each other. I also appreciate the efforts you have been going to in order to keep to time and arrive and collect promptly – this is really helpful to us as we adjust to more site users.

As you know we are continuing to work hard for all of our children, by reducing class sizes to pods of 15 we have doubled the number of staff needed to teach the pods.
