Behaviour for Learning expectations

Year 3

Year 3 have been amazing this half term. They have joined in their online learning enthusiastically every day and have produced some beautiful artwork, fabulous writing and thorough scientific observations. They have also been supported by amazing parents

and family members so we would like to thank you all so much for supporting learning and for joining in with such enthusiasm every day.

This week in Maths, we have been putting our mathematical skills to use in solving problems from everyday life. We have compared numbers using our division and multiplication skills as well as used bar models to visually solve word problems.

In Writing and Grammar, we have talked about the features of instruction texts. We will continue this by planning and writing our own instruction text. We used 'How to uncover a Soupee Bird' to engage our imaginations in order to plan and write our own instruction text on how to capture our own imaginary creatures!

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
Spellings this week has continued our learning from last week (the suffix 'tion') and we have learnt that the suffix 'cian' makes the same sound but is spelt differently. We also learnt that we could add the suffix 'cian' to our words that end in 'c' to change them into nouns that mean a person who does something (music - musician / magic - magician / electric - electrician).



We have continued with our learning on the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age in Science by studying rocks and soils and learning about how fossils are formed. We also learnt about what bones and muscles do and discovered why bones and skeletons from the Stone Age survive for millions of years but muscles don't.

The children have also enjoyed music this week and the singing has been beautiful!


We hope that you enjoy looking at some of the photos of our amazing work, we are just sorry that we can't show you everything that we have been sent.




Skyla, Nicholas and Lincoln's rock observations and experiments in science:



Maths - During maths this week the children have been working on perimeter. The children have used the knowledge they learnt last week to convert units of measurement to calculate the perimeter of a square, rectangle and a compound shape. The children have been developing strategies to support their calculations.



English - During writing this week the children have been working on a variety of activities recapping the genres we have already looked at this year. This has included writing setting descriptions – using adjectives, expanded noun phrases and similes, dialogue, poetry and creating balanced arguments.

Spellings - The prefix for spellings this week was auto-, auto- means 'self' or 'own'

Grammar - This week the children have been identifying homophones and near homophones

RE - During RE lessons the children continued their learning of the 5 pillars of Islam – focusing on Hajj and Salah.

Art - In our art sessions we have been looking at Greek vases – the children have been creating their own Greek vases using the templates provided. They started the week by creating different patterning techniques and then added pictures to show a story on their vase.
