









Skyla using inverted commas in her writing

Year 4



In Maths this week, the children have been recapping their knowledge of fractions. They have investigated unit and non-unit fractions as well as what equivalent fractions are.

During Writing, the children have moved into the innovate phase of play script writing, focussing on the Shakespeare play Macbeth. They have enjoyed taking it in turns to act out the characters and describe the setting and characters within the play.



During topic afternoons, the children have continued their learning of the Ancient Greeks, focussing on the Gods and the Battle of Marathon. The children made fact files to describe the Gods using their own research.



The children have continued their afternoon sessions on E-Safety and identified strategies of how to keep themselves safe online or in gaming platforms.


