## Literacy




We will be retelling the story of 'The Very Busy Spider' using a story map and trying to change some of the characters. We will be reading some new books over the week. We will be reading 'Mr Gumpy's Motor Car' by John Burningham and 'Owl Babies' by Martin Waddell. We will be learning our phonics and practising reading and spelling with the sounds we know. We will be practising our handwriting and writing words and phrases about things on the ground.



This week we continue thinking about things that live or move on the ground. We will be thinking about mini-beasts and vehicles that travel on the ground. We will think about how mini-beasts move on the ground. Do they all have legs? Can we guess the mini-beast from clues we are given about them?

#### How can you help at home?

This term we are really focusing on developing speaking and listening skills. We are making sure all the children understand some basic vocabulary. In addition, we are also extending their vocabulary by introducing them to words that they may not know. Please spend time talking to your child about the words and using them at home. We need to ensure they know them, understand them and can use them in their talk. We have now almost completed a NELI unit so we are checking we all know these words related to people who help us:

postman, van, envelope, stamp, firefighter, police officer, help, fire engine, ambulance, police car, siren, doctor, vet, healthy, ill, dentist, optician, glasses, check,

Please continue to practise sounds, words and reading books with your child. Practise orally blending and remember to read to your child and talk about stories with them. Please keep all reading in the children's bag so it is returned to school each day - thank you! Please use numbers and shapes whenever you can, in everyday life, to further develop their mathematical understanding and enjoyment.
