Advance notice – Resurfacing on Ringmead

We have been notified by Bracknell Forest Council that they will be carrying out road resurfacing works on Ringmead on the stretch of road between Wroxham and Welbeck. These works are scheduled to commence on Wednesday 9 June and should be completed by Thursday 10 June but delays are possible. Signs will be erected at the roadside advising of any changes.

The works will be carried out during the day between 9.30am and 3.30pm and will involve closures of the road during this time and a diversion being put in place. Unfortunately this will cause some disruption and inconvenience but the works are essential to maintain the condition of the public highway.

Caterpillars

The children in our Nursery have been learning the story 'The Train Ride'. They have designed and painted their own train and had a go at moving along like a train by chugging along with their arms and going fast and slow. They have also been using the small world train set to retell the story they have learned.



Butterflies

Reception children have been learning all about things that live, move and grow in and on the ground. They have been looking about plants and finding out about how they grow and have had a go at designing their own flower garden. They have looked at mini-beasts and earthworms and also been thinking about the different vehicles there are that travel on the ground. What a busy half-term!































Foxes, Badgers and Hedgehogs

The children in Years 1&2 have been learning all about what plants need to grow for their topic work this half-term. They enjoyed an afternoon of gardening and planting to start the half-term and have made some fantastic clay sunflowers. GREAT work everyone!



Eagles and Kestrels

This half-term Year 3 have been learning about the Egyptians. They have enjoyed an immersive Egyptian experience where they entered the classroom after break through a dark tunnel (blanket covered tables) into a darkened classroom with a suspenseful pyramid soundtrack to add atmosphere. They've learnt about the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb and written mystery stories set in Egypt. The children have also enjoyed performance poetry, where they studied a traditional African song and a poem called 'I am an African Child' What a great way to celebrate the recent Multi-Cultural Day!



Falcons and Hawks

Year 4 have been looking at chocolate this half-term. They have been reading Mayan Folktales and discovering where chocolate originates from. The children have been creating and designing their own chocolate packaging using Mayan weaving methods and will be creating their own box of chocolate assortments after half-term. They have been reading the story of 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory' and have been enjoying making comparisons to the original movie.

Children in Year 4 have been implementing the zones of regulation and finding calming strategies to help them stay on task. They have been having fun through the practising of yoga and developing their own strategies of mindfulness.



They've even managed to find time to do some gardening and tidying up in our quiet area!



Tigers, Lions and Panthers

Year 5 and 6 have been learning all about democracy throughout history. They explored practices in Ancient Greek times and reflected on the changes to the system today. Linked throughout to British Values, they reflected on the importance of tolerance, rule of law and individual liberty. In English, the children have written their own political manifestos and explored may different types of political views through class texts. To conclude the unit, they held mock elections where the children had to present key policies and vote at our Polling Station to have their opinion heard. It was a great success with different outcomes in all three classes. In Art, we have celebrated the changes over time to democracy by creating Greek inspired clay pots painted with a design reminiscent of that period.
