RE: NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. online programme September 2023

This month we will be participating in the **NSPCC's** *Speak out. Stay safe.* online programme. This consists of an online video and supporting classroom-based activities. *Speak out. Stay safe.* is a safeguarding programme available to all primary schools in the UK and Channel Islands. It aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse in a child friendly way. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried and to share with a safe and trusted adult.

In the online video, the *Speak out. Stay safe*. messages are delivered in a fun and interactive way with the help of their mascot Buddy as well as special guest appearances from Ant and Dec. Following on from the video, specially trained NSPCC volunteers will also be delivering a workshop to our Year 5/6 children that will build-on and deepen pupils' learning gained from the assembly.

The virtual assembly lets the children know what safe behaviours are and what are not by talking about the following.

- Bullying
- Neglect
- Physical abuse
- Sexual abuse
- Emotional abuse
