

Literacy



This week, we will be learning to retell the traditional story of 'The Three Little Pigs' using a story map to help us. We will also listen to the story of Noah's Ark.

In phonics, we will be revising the sounds we have learned that we are finding harder to remember or are slower at. We are now in groups with other children at the same stage of reading as we are. We will all be practising oral blending, blending words, practising writing sounds and spelling words with the sounds we know well. We are all practising writing our names, forming all the letters in them correctly.

Maths



This week we are learning to recite numbers to 20 forwards and back.

We will learn number formation for 8 and listen to maths related stories.

We will say days, months and times of day associated with activities (e.g. morning).

In Mastering numbers, we will focus on the comparison of sets by matching. We will be using the language of comparison: more than, fewer than, and equal number.

Topic



This week we continue our new topic on 'Special times, people, places and things'. Elmer was a very special elephant who was all the colours of the rainbow! We will explore colours and what happens when we mix colours together, like red and yellow, or red and blue. We will try and mix colours to paint our own rainbow.

We will talk about some people who are special to us like our family and friends. We will also remember people who died in the past on 11th November - Remembrance Day.



Messages

We hope you all enjoyed celebrating Bonfire Night last week! The weather is changing quickly so please can you make sure your child has a warm, waterproof coat, ideally with a hood, and a warm hat, gloves, etc. Please name everything, including the gloves! If you can send in waterproof bottoms (or an all in one), they will be able to access more of the playground on wet days. All children still need wellies to access the back area.

Please remember each Friday to take out earrings at home for PE and we ask girls wear socks, not tights, unless they can put these on by themselves. Thank you!

Remember school starts at 8.45 and children should be in the classroom by then. At the end of the day, children should stay with their grown up and not go onto the grass areas or play equipment.

We have a phonics meeting next week on Friday 21st November - looking at reading special-friends and red words. If you can come along, please come to the main school reception at 2.45pm.

How can you help at home?

The children are now grouped for phonics according to their stage of reading. Some are finding it difficult to remember their sounds and really need your help to practise them at home. Other children know quite a lot with just a few gaps but cannot yet orally blend. These children need help to practise their Fred Talk games at home (please see the links). Other children know most of their sounds and can orally blend. These children are just starting to read words and need to practise reading any sent home. All children need to keep practising their sounds and oral blending. Try and get faster saying the sounds and start orally blending some 4 sounds words like stop, if they can do 3 sound words. Please keep practising writing the sounds and developing fine motor skills.

Please share books and read to your child every night if you can. Try and develop a love of reading that will stay with them for the rest of their lives!

You can also support your child's learning by doing some of the suggested activities from the maths home learning. We will sometimes send home ideas to support our topic learning too!
